Supplemental Questions

- 3. Do you think the notion of people under the direct rule of God is workable, or is it only a pipe-dream?
- 4. How would you explain the difference between seeking the advice of a wise friend and seeking God's guidance with the help of mature and faithful Christians?

Read Matthew 18:19-20

- 5. How is fellowship with other Christians vital to seeking both individual and corporate guidance from God?
- 6. The our culture places a heavy emphasis on individualism. Do you see any negative results of this in our churches?
- 7. What sometimes holds us back from asking close Christian friends to help us seek God's guidance before making a decision or entering on a new path?

Read 1 John 4:1-16

- 8. What should you change in your life (either add or drop from your life) in order to deepen your intimacy with Christ?
- 9. How will our thinking change if we would ask: "What is God's will, and how can I adjust my life to Him?"

Read Philippians 2:13
