CIESTIONS Felicitations - a monthly publication of Felicity Christian Church October, 2025

One of the things I love most about Jesus is the way He asked questions. He didn't ask them because He didn't know the answer—He asked them because He wanted people to think deeply, to search their hearts, and to discover truth for themselves. When you read through the Gospels, you realize that some of the most life-changing moments began with a simple question from Jesus.

That's why we've called our current sermon series *Red Letter Questions*. We're walking through some of those questions together on Sunday mornings. My hope is that each week, you'll hear Jesus not just speaking to people long ago, but asking *you* these questions in the present. His words are alive, and they invite us to examine our faith, our fears, our doubts, and our devotion to Him.

In the month of October, we'll journey through four of these powerful questions:

• October 5 – "Do you want to get well?" (John 5:1–15)

Jesus asked this to a man who had been waiting decades for healing. What an odd question—of course he wanted to get well! Or did he? Sometimes we grow comfortable in our struggles or excuses. Jesus' question pushes us to be honest about whether we truly want Him to make us whole.

• October 12 – "Why do you doubt?" (Matthew 14:22–33)

When Peter stepped out of the boat, he actually walked on water—until he lost focus and started to sink. We've all been there, haven't we? Jesus' question to Peter echoes in our hearts too: why do we let fear overshadow faith? This message will remind us that Jesus doesn't let us drown in our doubts; He reaches out His hand.

• October 19 – "Do you see this woman?" (Luke 7:36–50)

At Simon the Pharisee's dinner party, everyone saw the woman as a sinner—everyone but Jesus. He saw her faith, her love, and her heart. This story challenges us to open our eyes and truly see people the way Jesus does—with compassion instead of condemnation, with mercy instead of judgment.

• October 26 – "Do you love me?" (John 21:15–19)

After Peter's denial, Jesus didn't scold him—He restored him. And He did it with this tender but searching question. In the end, this is the question that matters most in our lives. Do we love Jesus? Because everything else—our service, our obedience, our mission—flows from our answer.

Friends, I want to encourage you not just to hear these questions, but to wrestle with them. Imagine Jesus looking at *you* and asking, "Do you want to get well?" or "Do you love me?" How would you answer? These questions are not meant to shame us, but to invite us into deeper faith, greater trust, and closer walk with our Savior.

I'm excited to walk through these passages with you this October. I believe God is going to use them to stir our hearts and strengthen our church. Let's keep leaning in together and listening closely to the voice of Jesus—the One who still asks the best questions.




Orange and Black Day!

as a church family.








FCC KIDS




